The fallow ground of our hearts is indeed being broken up here in Oglala as we seek His Face in fasting and prayer; we sincerely await His Coming which we know is only a matter of time... Then even from the soil of these "Badlands" God can and will reap a most beautiful harvest!

There is a new thing that has taken place here on Pine Ridge Indian Reservation and it has everything to do with praver and fasting. Last September, our friends Ted Standing Soldier and Wade McHargue were praying together and discussing some of the issues we face as Christians on the reservation. The Holy Spirit prompted them to start a prayer meeting. It was to be every Monday morning with the purpose of bringing the body of Christ together across the reservation, to encourage one another, and to seek the Face of God together in prayer. It was a very simple vet complicated task. You see, here on the reservation (as I'm sure it is the same with whatever community or city you live in), unity among churches and Christians is a very rare and all but given up on "luxury." There is so much that divides us that we figure it's best to stay neutral and have the mentality of "you stay on your side and we will stay on ours." We think it wisdom, when really it grieves the Heart of the Father. Just read John 17 and you will see His wish and desire on this subject of unity.

Anyway, they started meeting at the Pine Ridge Gospel Fellowship and invited all the area ministers and believers to just come with no other agenda than to pray and seek His Face. At first, I myself was apprehensive. I could give you theological excuses, but in truth it was just my pride and laziness that kept me. Thank the Holy Spirit and the persistence of my friend Ted that I finally got over myself and started attending and since, I haven't been the same.

Charles Finney says, "Nothing knits together Christian hearts better than united prayer." I can testify to that. Now we are seeing God tear down walls of division and strife that have stood for many years, separating His people and not allowing for His Spirit to move freely here among the Lakota. There have been tears of forgiveness and repentance, sighs of joy and relief; bonds between brothers and sisters that were once broken and shattered are now made new and whole—and this is only just the beginning. From these prayer meetings on Monday, the Holy Spirit has also directed us to call our churches and ministries to pray and fast along with us. Since January, we are now in the process to take one day a month and call a sacred fast. On that day, we meet in a different community every month to celebrate with a time of prayer and rejoicing. So far we have gone to four different churches across the reservation and have made plans for the other eight months of this year.

Moreover, on Sunday April 13th three churches including ours joined together for Sunday morning worship. Three different denominations, three different pastors and congregations who have "found encouragement in Christ, comfort from His Love, fellowship of the Spirit, affection and mercy and so since, fulfill His Joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind" as we worship "our One Lord, One God and Father of all" (Philippians 2:1-2)! Amen! How's that for something different?

As you can tell, I am excited about all this! I see God setting the stage for something Beautiful and Mighty that will Glorify His Name here in Oglala and across the reservation as He brings His lost sheep home. We ask that you join with us in this season of prayer and fasting and who knows, maybe you will find yourself praying and worshipping alongside that person who at one time was your enemy but now by the Grace of God has become your brother or sister.
