## **Church Family**

In John 5, Jesus encounters a man by a pool. This pool was no ordinary pool. According to the tradition, at certain times, an angel would come to stir the water, and whoever stepped in first would be healed of any illness or malady they may have had. So you can imagine the crowd that surrounded this pool; the lame, the sick, and the dying, all laying there waiting with anticipation and anxiety, hoping to be the first in when the water moved. It is in this atmosphere that Jesus comes looking for one specific man.

This particular man had been an invalid for over thirtyeight years of his life and had been, for a long time, lying by this pool hoping he would make it into these healing waters. Jesus sees him lying there and asks him a simple question. "Do you want to be healed?" Now instead of giving Him the simple answer of "Yes" (I mean, that is why he is lying by this pool in the first place, right?), he does what a lot of us do when faced with the simple questions of the Promises of God: he starts to explain why he can**not** be healed and begins to make excuses to justify his brokenness, "There is no one to help me into the pool, I am not fast enough, I am too far away, I am not able." All through these excuses, the Great Healer Himself is standing right there next to him and asking him. "Do you want to be healed?" The healing this man has hoped for, for so many years, is within his grasp, but all he can see is the many reasons why it cannot be possible. And yet, Jesus in His Mercy ignores his excuses and tells the man what he must do. "Get up, take up your bed and walk." It was as if He was saying, "Quit looking at all the reasons of why it **cannot** happen and look at the One, Me, the Only One who can make it happen." The man hears the voice of Jesus, obeys—and is completely healed.

I believe this encounter is a prophetic picture of what God is doing here in Oglala, all across this Lakota Nation. and hopefully all over America. I can hear the voice of Jesus asking us this simple question, "Do you want to be healed?" You would think our answer is yes, but the truth is, for years, for decades, we've been answering this question just as that man did; with all our fears, all our apprehensions, our excuses and reasons for why it can**not** happen, and then we wonder why we are still lying down in our brokenness with our healing/deliverance seemingly forever out of reach. I believe Jesus in His Great Mercy and Compassion is passing over all our excuses and is now telling the Lakota people, the church here on the reservation and all across America, "Get up, take up your bed and walk." It is time. No more excuses, no more reasons why it cannot be and no more waiting for something to happen. We know all the reasons why healing, deliverance and salvation cannot come to the Lakota people, to the churches in this land and beyond. the enemy has made the "cannots" abundantly clear.

We read about it in the news and see it displayed with every suicide, every broken home and every lost cause. And yet, Jesus has been standing here the whole time telling us that **He can** and more so **wants** to bring healing to our brokenness, hope to our despair, and life to our death. It is the Heart of the Father and easily within in His Power to heal us, spirit, soul and body, if only we will look to Jesus and heed his command to "Get up, take up our beds and walk."

Please continue to pray with us as we walk together with our Lakota brothers and sisters to learn and experience the Wonders and Love of our Father and expand His Kingdom to every corner of this land with the Good News that Jesus can and wants to heal us completely and perfectly. Thank you.

It was on a similar trip that I first came to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in 1992. I had never heard of this place and didn't know much about Native Americans in general. Having the school group here has made me think about the way God calls us to situations and places that on our own we might never have gone.

**M**y thoughts move on from here to the children that I see at the Rec Center every day. Which ones will God call to go to foreign lands to serve him? Who will he ask to stay and serve him right where they grew up? Will any of them be pastors or go to bible school? Will some of them become parents that share Christ with their children or work in jobs where they can be a light in the workplace?



It is not the gardening, the basketball, cooking or pushing kids on the swing that will have eternal value. It's not VBS, crafts or swim trips that really matter. But these are the avenues God has given us to share his love with this community just like he used a fun trip when I was a teenager to give me direction in my life.
