"I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through

their word; that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us."

These are some of the last words Jesus spoke before He heroically and humbly endured the agony of the Cross for the sake of His Creation, for us. In this prayer, we see the Heart of our King. His praying desire, his dying wish, is that we would be one together with each other and Him. I mean, what Father wouldn't want His children to love each other and get along? - We aim to fulfill that desire of His Heart and to be the answer to that prayer.

As most of you know, about two years ago a group of followers of Christ here on Pine Ridge began meeting once a week to pray together and bombard the Throne Room of God. We all recognized that what we were doing in ministry was not bearing the fruit we desired and that if anything Divine was ever to happen here in Lakota Country it was going to begin with us on our knees together in fasting and intercession. Those meetings are now held twice a week and have produced a true family of believers who do not hold tightly to denominations or reputation. Through the Spirit of God we have laid aside our egos and divisive hang-ups to bow together at the Feet of Jesus to say, "Come Lord Jesus, Come."

From theses prayer meetings, the Unity service has been birthed. This past January, we held our first ever Sunday Morning Unity Service. We rented a gym in the Pine Ridge com-

munity and invited all the churches, ministries and Christians from across the Lakota Nation to come and worship together under the banner of Jesus. At least eight different churches sacrificed their own Sunday morning services to worship together, and over 200 people attended. It was a mighty victory for the Kingdom of God. The entire service was led by our Native Brothers and Sisters as we rejoiced as one body to celebrate the Name of Jesus. April 24th, we held our second Unity Service with the spiritually discerned focus on reconciliation. The Spirit is moving in Lakota Country!

Also as a result from our prayer meetings and another way in which the prayer of Jesus is being answered is that in January 2017, a group of Brothers from Pine Ridge, including myself, will travel to Germany to minister in the refugee camps. Our objective is to be spiritually led as we share the Gospel with those who are hurting and in need of Hope. As we minister alongside our German brothers and Sisters, we expect the Spirit to strengthen our unity and to make us more like Him, bringing glory to His name.

We want to be the answer to Jesus' prayer. We want to be one as He and the Father are one. Unified in our ministry team here at the Rec Center, unified together with our fellow Brothers and Sisters across the reservation, unified with you and all our Christian family around the world, and - most importantly - unified with Him through His Redemption and the Holy Spirit. Because when we are one, as Jesus says, "the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me" (John 17:21). We do want the world to know Him and His Love, don't we? Then it is time that we take to heart and do what our Brother Paul asks us to do, "endeavor to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3).

We love you guys and appreciate you greatly. Please continue to pray for us as we pray for you.

She knows the truth that she can find hope through Jesus but she seeks it out and then runs from it once again. To me it makes perfect sense because I've experienced it. I know it is a hard concept to grasp for a teen that has so much pain and many struggles. It is very hard to trust in God who can't be seen, touched, smelled... texted, facebooked or tweeted. So though I get impatient to see her grow in her faith, I also know that it is the Holy Spirit working in her to complete what He wants for her life. My job is to give account of the hope that is in me (I Peter 3:15), pray and trust God to do what He says He will do. And praise God He will do it!




Another welcome addition to our ministry is the new church van which we were able to purchase in March. Taking
